





## Concluding remarks on the occasion of the visit of the President of Italy to ICTP

March 27, 2008

Mr. President:

You have been kind to fit this meeting into your busy schedule, and you have been magnanimous to come to our Center and rename the main building after the inimitable Leonardo da Vinci. Our Centre can now proudly speak of a Leonardo da Vinci Building, a Galileo Galilei Building and an Enrico Fermi Building, all named after some of the greatest Italians. From the beginning, the Leonardo building (as I may now call it) has also been the seat of the Department of Theoretical Physics of the University of Trieste, which played a critical role in the formation of the Centre.

In return for your magnanimity, what can we do but to thank you with empty words? What can one present the President of the Republic who is its highest authority? The only higher authority is the land itself, and I take the liberty of citing from Virgil's "Georgics", Book II, a little piece that extols this land. What Virgil said more than two thousand years ago still holds true. I will read out an English translation but the Latin text will appear on the screen:

"With fruitful flocks and olives...

Here blooms perpetual spring, and summer here
In months that are not summer's; twice teem the flocks;
Twice doth the tree yield service of her fruit...

Mark too her cities, so many and so proud,
Of mighty toil the achievement, town after town
Up rugged precipices heaved and reared,
And rivers undergliding ancient walls."

Virgil's Georgics, Book II, lines 136+
